



Good Deeds for 9/11 Day

11 Ideas for Faith Communities

1. Host a Congregation-Wide Service Project

Organize a project such as assembling hygiene kits, packing food boxes, or distributing supplies to those in need.

2. Incorporate a 9/11 Day Blessing or Reflection

Include a special prayer, sermon, or reading during services that honors 9/11 and calls for unity and service.

3. Distribute Good Deed Pledge Cards

Invite members to pledge an act of kindness and display the cards in your entryway, bulletin board, or online.

4. Organize a Blood Drive

Partner with a local blood bank or hospital to host a donation event on or near 9/11.

5. Deliver Notes or Treats to First Responders

Encourage children or members to write thank-you notes and deliver baked goods to local firefighters, EMTs, or police officers.

6. Lead a Community Prayer Walk or Vigil

Host a neighborhood walk for peace or an interfaith candlelight gathering for remembrance and connection.

7. Volunteer at a Local Shelter or Food Pantry

Coordinate a group outing to serve meals, restock shelves, or clean spaces at a nearby nonprofit.

8. Support a Local School

Deliver donated school supplies or appreciation kits to teachers and students in underserved communities.

9. Invite Members to Share Stories or Testimonies

Encourage people to reflect on the meaning of 9/11 Day, and how service plays a role in their faith.

10. Create a "Kindness Wall"

Set up a space where children and adults can post drawings, prayers, or quotes about compassion and hope.

11. Promote Good Deeds in Your Communications

Use bulletins, newsletters, and social media to spotlight members' good deeds and invite wider participation using #911Day.
